Reason for Referral

Layla Morgan was referred by her school for a developmental assessment based on school performance. Results will help identify need for additional services and supports.

Background Information

Layla Morgan is an 8-year-old, Caucasian female. She is the second oldest of three children. She, along with her two siblings, came to the attention of the Department of Child and Family Services due to neglect. The family is currently participating in a voluntary, in-home intervention with the agency.

Layla is in the third grade and attends Jacksonville Elementary School. She receives special education services for delays in communication; social and emotional development; and physical development, specifically gross motor skills. She is on medication to control seizures. During an initial IEP meeting, it was recommended that Layla complete a developmental assessment to ensure all her needs are being met.

Clinical Impressions

Layla Morgan presents as a shy child with slight build and small stature. Over the course of the evaluation sessions, she engaged with the evaluator. Layla functions in the average range of intellectual functioning. Layla experiences delays in communication (receptive and expressive), and gross motor skills. No delays noted in fine motor skills. Visual-motor integration is functional with no impairments noted.

Recommendations

Continue school-based speech and physical/occupational therapies.

Involve child in sport activities (e.g., swimming, gymnastics) to encourage development of gross motor skills.
