Item 17: Physical Health of the Child

Each child in foster care has a complete physical examination by a qualified professional within 30 days of coming into care, unless the child had a complete physical within 60 days before entering care, and documentation of the examination can be obtained.	Reports of physical, dental, vision, and other examinations under "Medical" tab
Each child in foster care has a dental examination within 60 days of entering care, unless the child's last dental examination was completed within 60 days before entering care, and documentation of the examination can be obtained.	Case narratives
Children in foster care follow the recommended physical and dental examination schedule of the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) program.	
The child's caseworker maintains a record in the child's file of any medication required to treat chronic conditions like asthma, diabetes, etc. The record contains the dosage and frequency of the medication and is updated as changes occur.	

Item 18: Mental/Behavioral Health of the Child

Summary of State Policy Requirements	Location of Related Information in Case File
Each child in foster care participates in a mental/behavioral screening or assessment within 45 days of coming into care to identify any mental health/behavioral issues/needs, as well as appropriate services to address such.	Assessment or screening reports under "Mental/Behavioral Health" tab
The child's caseworker maintains a record of any psychotropic medications prescribed, including dosage and frequency, and updates the record as changes occur.	Caseworker narratives
Psychotropic medications are monitored for effect and dosage by the prescribing physician at intervals decided upon by the physician.	
If the child's caseworker has any concerns about the child's psychotropic medication(s), the caseworker is to bring those concerns to the child's prescribing physician for resolution.
