### **Safety Assessment and Safety Conclusion**

**A. Safety Threats:** Are negative family conditions and/or circumstances, and/or caregiver behaviors, emotions, attitudes, and perceptions that are out of control in the presence of a vulnerable child and therefore likely to have severe effects on a child at any time in the near future.

- Out-of-Control: refers to family behavior, condition, or situations which are unrestrained, resulting in an unpredictable and possibly chaotic family environment not subject to the family's influence, manipulation, or ability to control. Such out-of-control family conditions pose a danger.
- <u>Severity</u>: refers to the effects of maltreatment that have already occurred and/or potential for harsh effects
- <u>Imminent</u>: refers to the belief that dangerous family behaviors, conditions, or situations will remain active or become active within the next several days to within a month. This is consistent with a degree of certainty that, barring intervention, danger and severe harm are possible or even inevitable outcomes.
- Observable: refers to family behaviors, conditions, or situations representing a danger to a child that are specific, definite, real, can be seen and understood, and are subject to being reported and proven
- <u>Vulnerable Child</u>: refers to a child who is dependent on others for protection and exposed to circumstances that she or he is powerless to manage and is susceptible, accessible, or available to a threatening person and/or persons in authority over him or her. Vulnerability is judged according to age, physical and emotional development, ability to communicate needs, degree of mobility, size, and level of dependence and susceptibility. This definition also applies to all young children ages 0 to 6 and older children who, for whatever reason, are not able to protect themselves or seek help from protective others.
